OUR 2019/20 OUTREACH HUB OFFER FOR SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES







INTRODUCTION

The National Collaborative Outreach Programme (NCOP) aims to support young people to make well-informed decisions about their future education and to reduce the gap in higher education participation between the most and least represented groups. It started in January 2017 and is funded by the Office for Students (OfS). The NCOP brings together 29 partnerships of universities, colleges, schools and other local agencies to deliver sustained and progressive programmes of higher education outreach to young people aged 13 and above. Work is particularly focused on geographical areas in England where participation in higher education is low overall and lower than expected given local GCSE results.





The partnership operating in North Yorkshire is NCOP York & North Yorkshire, known locally as FutureHY. Partners include: University Centre Askham Bryan, Craven College, CU Scarborough, Harrogate College, Scarborough TEC, Selby College, York College, University of York and York St John University, as well as York City Council, North Yorkshire County Council, LEP/Careers Enterprise Company (CEC), National Citizen Service (NCS), North Yorkshire Coast Opportunity Area, NYBEP and York Cares.

Recent Careers Strategy Guidance brings increased accountability for school/college leaders to deliver a co-ordinated whole school/college approach to careers guidance for all students. FutureHY is keen to ensure that the activity on offer through NCOP also goes some way to supporting schools, colleges and indeed community groups to meet this responsibility.

All of the FutureHY outreach interventions are underpinned by a robust monitoring and evaluation framework.

FUTUREHY CORE PROSPECTUS

This FutureHY core prospectus outlines the activity programme schools, colleges and other stakeholders can access, free of charge, that will support informed progression and career pathways for young people.

A short summary of each activity allows co-ordinators to decide whether or not the outreach is appropriate for the young people in their care. Some interventions are offered to all students and others aimed only at NCOP students.

Each activity has been mapped against both the FutureHY progression framework and the Gatsby Benchmarks, which will allow co-ordinators to engage confidently with the NCOP offer.

OUR PROGRESSION FRAMEWORK

The framework seeks to develop aims and strive for outcomes which are focused around five key strands. These five strands below have been developed with the local context in mind, as well as drawing upon the theoretical work of Pierre Bourdieu. This is a dynamic framework, and it is anticipated that this will evolve over the course of the programme as our knowledge builds and as local and national priorities adjust.

KNOW



Develop young people's knowledge and awareness of the benefits of higher education

CHOOSE



Develop young people's capacity to navigate the Higher Education sector and make informed choices

BECOME



Develop young people's confidence and resilience to negotiate the challenges of university life

PRACTISE



Develop young people's study skills and capacity for academic attainment

UNDERSTAND



Develop young people's understanding by contextualising subject knowledge

GATSBY BENCHMARKS

The Gatsby Benchmarks, which are eight principles of best practice, have been mapped against our activities. This is a nationally recognised framework for good careers guidance.

BENCHMARK	GATSBY STATEMENT		
1. A Stable Careers Programme	Every school and college should have an embedded programme of career education and guidance that is known and understood by pupils, teachers, governors and employers		
2. Learning from Career & Labour Market Information	Every pupil, and their parents, should have access to good quality information about future study options and labour market opportunities.		
3. Addressing the Needs of Each Pupil	Pupils have different career guidance needs at different stages. Opportunities for advice and support need to be tailored to the needs of each pupil. A school's careers programme should embed equality and diversity considerations throughout.		
4. Linking Curriculum Learning to Careers	All teachers should link curriculum learning with careers. STEM subject teachers should highlight the relevance of STEM subjects for a wide range of career paths.		
5. Encounters with Employers & Employees	Every pupil should have multiple opportunities to learn from employers about work, employment and the skills that are valued in the workplace. This can be through a range of enrichment activities including visiting speakers, mentoring and enterprise schemes.		
6. Experiences of Workplaces	Every pupil should have first-hand experience of the workplace through work visits, work shadowing and/or work experience to help their exploration of career opportunities and expand their networks.		
7. Encounters with Further and Higher Education	All pupils should understand the full range of learning opportunities that are available to them. This includes both academic and vocational routes and learning in schools, colleges, universities and in the workplace.		
8. Personal Guidance	Every pupil should have opportunities for guidance interviews with a career adviser, provided that they are trained to an appropriate level.


